However, there might sometimes be important reasons why we would have to reveal someone's name and address, even though they have asked for them not to be published. We would get in touch with the person and ask their views before we finally decided to reveal the information.

Further comments

The Environment (Wales) Act 2016 makes provision for the National Natural Resource Policy (NNRP). This will set out the Welsh Government's priorities in relation to the sustainable management of natural resources and will be a key consideration to inform the emerging NDF in helping to direct the right development to the right place. By embedding SMNR into the decision-making process in the NDF, this will set the direction on how the strategic management of natural resources should inform Strategic Development Plans and Local Development Plans, and help ensure decision-making that is consistent with requirements in the Wellbeing and Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015.

The NNRP will be informed by The State of Natural Resources Report (SoNaRR). This will reflect NRW's assessment of the state of natural resources in relation to Wales, and will provide the evidence base for the National Natural Resources Policy (NNRP). It is important therefore that the Welsh Government (WG) considers the SoNaRR and the NNRP when identifying and considering the main issues for the NDF, and when developing and consulting on the NDF vision, objectives, and options. The NDF will also need to integrate with the provisions of the emerging Wales National Marine Plan.

The NNRP will not be finalised until March 2017. Whilst we recognise that the vision, objectives, and options will be developed between July 2016 and May 2017, we recommend that this period may need to be extended should the WG consider that this does not provide sufficient time for it to fully consider the environmental information and priorities identified in the NNRP and how it should inform the NDF vision, objectives, and options.
