





Welcome to The Arch at Penbwlichbodcoll - 'the head of the pass of lost existence'!

The old masonry arch was built by Thomas Johnes of Hafod in 1810 to mark the Golden Jubilee of George III. It was once the gateway to the Hafod Estate.

A great place to walk
This corner of the original Hafod Estate offers a range of trails, of which lead through huge beech trees planted over 200 years ago by Thomas Johnes, who designed the nearby Hafod mansion and grounds. The viewpoint from the Panorama Walk gives you far-reaching views of Mid Wales.

Fighting tree disease at The Arch


We have felled groups of larch trees infected with the fungal disease *Phytophthora ramorum* here to help stop it spreading. The walking trails all pass through areas of recently felled trees and there are now more views from the paths to the surrounding hills.
