## Welcome to Coed Pen Arthur in the Brecon Beacons National Park

This 225-hectare (556 acres) forest lies on the western edge of the National Park. This woodland is made up of an attractive mix of conifers and native broadleaved trees.

## Coedwigoedd Bannau Brycheiniog Brecon Beacons Forests

### Coedwigoedd sy'n gweddru'r parc

Rydym yn gofalu am y goedwig hwn ar gyfer cenedlaethau'r dyfodol. Mae hyn yn golygu:

- dewis amrediad ehangach o goed
- ystyried y mathau o bridd
- gwella'r dirwedd
- addasu i hinsawdd sy'n newid cynllion sut y bydd coed a choetiroedd y dyfodol yn edrych
- planning how future trees and woodlands will look

Rydym eisiau gweld ein coedwigoedd yn:

- dal i gynhyrchu pren ar gyfer economi Cymru
- cynnig cyfleoedd hamdden ichi megis cerdded, seiclo ac ymlacio
- gwella ansawdd dŵr
- cloi carbon
- bod o fudd i fywyd gwylt

Rydym hefyd yn lliniaru'r cyrion rhwng y goedwig a'r rhosir agored fel bôr dirwedd yn edrych yn fwyl naturiol.

Yn gyffredinol, rydym yn dynnu gweld ein coedwig mewn cytgodol a thirwedd y parc cenedlaethol ehangach, nawr ac mewn blynnydoedd i ddod.

### Forest fit for the park

We are looking after this forest for future generations. This means:

- choosing a wider range of trees
- considering soil types
- enhancing the landscape
- adapting to a changing climate
- planning how future trees and woodlands will look

We want our forests to:

- keep producing timber for the welsh economy
- offer you recreational opportunities like walking, cycling and relaxation
- improve water quality
- lock carbon
- benefit wildlife

We are also softening the edges between the forest and open moorland to create a more natural appearance in the landscape.

Overall, we want our forests to be in harmony with the wider national park landscape, now and in future years to come.

## Beth allwch ei wneud o'r fan hon

O'r fan hon gallwch ddilyn y llwybr o'ch blaen i ymuno â ffywod y goedwig yr holl ffordd i fyny (3.2km/2 miles one way with 270m/900ft climb, plus 400m mini-circuit from end of road - allow 3 hours) to a spectacular viewpoint with a mini-circuit through moorland. On one side there are great views of the Tywi Valley, and on the other views of Black Mountain.

## Cylch daith Garn Goch

Mae Ffordd y Bannau yn llwybr 99m/159km o hyd drwy Barc Cenedlaethol Bannau Brycheiniog. Gall darllenwyr mapiau da gerdded rhan o ran fwyaf gorllewinol y llwybr hwn drwy gychwyn ar y llwybr cyhoeddus sy'n rhedeg drwy'r goedwig ym Manc Carreg-foel-gam i'r gogledd gan ddilyn ffyrdd tramwy cyhoeddus at Garn Goch a dychwelyd ar yr is-ffordd i'r dwyrrain o Fethlehem. Mae'r daith gerdded hon yn 13km/8m, heb farciâu ffodd, i gerddwyr profiadol yn unig ac nid yw ar dir Cyfoeth Naturiol Cymru unwaith byddwch wedi gadael y goedwig.

## What you can do from here

From here you can follow the path ahead to join forest roads all the way up (3.2km/2 miles one way with 270m/900ft climb, plus 400m mini-circuit from end of road - allow 3 hours) to a spectacular viewpoint with a mini-circuit through moorland. On one side there are great views of the Tywi Valley, and on the other views of Black Mountain.


## Garn Goch circular

The Beacons Way is a 99m/159km long distance route through the Brecon Beacons National Park. Good map-readers can walk a section of the western-most section of this trail by picking up the public footpath that runs through the forest at Bane-Carreg-foel-gam northwards following public rights of way at Garn Goch and returning on the minor road to the east of Bethlehem. This walk is 13km/8m, not waymarked, for experienced walkers only and not on Natural Resources Wales land once you leave the forest.



Pellter | Distance: 4½mi | 7.2km

**Uchaffwyntiau:** Golygfeydd gwych ar ddiwrnod clir o'r Mynydd Du a Dyffryn Tywi yw'ch gwobr am ddringo'n hir i ben Banc Carreg-foel-gam (350m/1150ft troedfedd uwchben lefel y môr).

A yw'r daith hon yn iawn i chi? Mae'r daith i fyny'r rhw bob cam at y llecyn gwyllo ac felly mae angen lefel ffîtrwydd uchel. Mae'r cylch bychan ar y brig yn gallu bod yn wylb ac felly argymhellwn esgidiau cerdded ar gyfer y daith hon, sydd heb farciâu ffodd.

**Highlights:** Great views on a clear day of the Black Mountain and the Tywi Valley are your reward for a long climb up to Banc Carreg-foel-gam (350m/1150ft above sea level).

Is this walk right for you? This walk is uphill all the way to the viewpoint so a high level of fitness is needed. The mini-circuit at the top can be wet so we recommend walking boots for this route, which is not waymarked.
